Students will be able to stay in "Gakuin Hall (Kaikan)" on the AGU Nisshin campus. They will be given a single room equipped with a TV,

• Meals

Students can enjoy a buffetstyle breakfast featuring both Japanese and Western-style food at a school cafeteria on weekdays. At lunchtime and dinnertime on weekdays, AGU students will guide participating students to school cafeterias or restaurants off campus.

• Lectures

Participating students will learn Japanese language for beginners, crucial things like selfintroductions, greetings, and Japanese for everyday communication. By the end of the course, students will be able to give short speeches in Japanese on a variety of topics. During the lectures on Japanese culture, Japanese and native Englishspeaking professors will introduce Japanese culture, religion and society in English from a number of different academic viewpoints.







• Zen Meditation & Tea Ceremony

AGU is founded on the ideals of gratitude and compassion, two of the guiding principles of Soto Zen Buddhism. Participants will experience the Soto Zen style of meditation in the Zen Meditation Hall on the AG() campus. It is the only active Meditation Hall on any university campus in Japan. The Japanese Tea Ceremony is closely linked to Zen Buddhism, and the AGU Tea Ceremony Club will introduce participants to the Japanese Tea Ceremony, and give them a chance to practice it for themselves.

• Excursions to Toyota Kaikan & Tokugawa Museum and Gardens Participants will enjoy a plant tour at Toyota Motor Corporation, perhaps the most famous automobile manufacturer in the world, which is headquartered in Aichi Prefecture. They will also be able to explore Toyota Kaikan, where the Toyota brand, past present and future, is on display.

Another excursion will be to the lovely and fascinating Tokugawa Museum and Gardens. The Museum preserves the extensive holdings of the Owari branch of the Tokugawa family. Tokugawa-en is a traditional Japanese garden with walkways winding around a central pond symbolizing the ocean. The museum and garden were made on the residential site of the former Owari branch of the Tokugawa family, the family that ruled Japan for over two centuries from 1600 to the mid-19th Century







Free Time

AGU students will guide participants around Aichi Gakuin University and the city of Nagoya. Large shopping malls and the Toyota Automobile Museum are located within walking distance of the AGU Nisshin Campus, where participants will stay. By public transportation, students can easily access the center of Nagoya, which is located in the central part of the island of Honshu.

There are many popular tourist destinations in Nagoya, including Nagoya Castle, Nagoya Public Aquarium, Osu Shopping District, and Toyota Commemorative Museum of Industry and Technology, to name only a few. They are all excellent for weekend outings.
