Admissions Requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for the Summer School.

However, students should have an approximate IELTS levels of 4.0-5.5 to get the most benefit from the course (no certificate is required for entry).

Class Size

The Summer School will run as a single class with a minimum 10 students. If application numbers are sufficiently high, an additional class may run.

Online Registration

English Levels

The Summer School is designed for students with approximate IELTS levels of 4.0-5.5 (no certificate is required).

The Summer School will run as a single class without a placement test.

Teachers will assess student levels throughout the programme; beginning with the 'Getting to know you' type activities on their first day where students engage in writing things about themselves or each other, present information about themselves, their own interests and aspirations, listen to each other and take notes, report on their findings etc. This way we will identify our stronger students and make sure they are challenged appropriately during the course.

We teach the same lesson and challenge our students in different ways according to their level (ability). For example, stronger students will have more challenging tasks to do which could involve vocabulary or grammar tasks, mini research, delivering longer presentations and/or working in separate breakout rooms.

Student Report

Although there are no formal exams, the teachers will use their observation and professional judgement of the students to provide a report detailing a level grading (e.g. Upper intermediate) in each of the key skills for every student.

Each student who completes the Summer School will receive a detailed report and Certificate of Attendance in PDF format from Canterbury Christ Church University.
