Public Transportation	The public transportation in Seoul is very convenient and efficient. Students will be able to visit many places of interest by taking the city bus and subways.  The closest subway station from campus is Light Rail Jeongneung(Kookmin University) station and Line 4 Gireum Station. There are many buses going to different districts from the University's main gate. Students are recommended to purchase a transportation card(T-money). (Students can add value to T-money at convenience stores on campus)
Transportation fare	Subway: Basic fare KRW 1,350won (T-money: KRW 1,250won) * Additional fare charged by distance City Bus: Single journey KRW 1,300 won (T-money: KRW 1,200won)
University Location Information	Our campus, located in the Northern part of Seoul, is surrounded by Bukhansan National Mountain Park. As our local community is mostly residential area, we provide safe environment for students. While students study at an independent campus setting, students can visit Gyeongbokgung palace/Bukchon Hanok Village, Daehakro (Center of performing arts and culture) and Dongdaemun Design Plaza during their free time. (Above place of interests are approx. 30 minutes by public transportation)

Visa	<p>Students studying in Korea according to the agreement between their home university and Kookmin University needs to apply for the student visa(<b>Type: D-2-6</b>) with the Certificate of Admission issued by Kookmin University before arriving at Korea.</p>

Restrictions for International Students	<p>Students will need to select a major/department at Kookmin and will need to be approved by the major/department in order to Study at our university. (The department/major may reject the application)</p> <p>Students must register their courses online and the courses should be mainly chosen from the assigned major/department and electives. (Courses from different major/departments may be restricted)</p>		
Standard Credit Load for Term (Fall or Winter)	We recommend that exchange students take 12~15 credits during one semester. The minimum course load is 10 credits and maximum course load is 17~19 credits depending on the assigned major.		
Standard Course Load for an Academic Year	With 12~15 credits per semester, a full course load for an academic year would be 24~30 credits.		
Important Notes About Classes / Courses	Students may register <b>courses with prerequisites</b> during the add & drop period (first week of the semester) with a confirmation from the department. (if there are enough space only)		
	<p>If there are not enough students registered for a certain course after the Course registration or Add &amp; drop period, <u>the course may be canceled.</u></p> <p><u>Language of instruction may change to Korean</u> if the demand for a course is low.</p>

Course Registration	<p>Students need to register for courses online before coming to Kookmin University. (Normally 2~3 weeks before the beginning of the semester) As Course registration in Korean Universities are very competitive and courses in high demand will fill up within seconds, it is important for students to follow our guide and register for courses.</p>		
	<p>The International Affairs Division can not register courses on behalf of the students and <b>taking a certain course is not guaranteed.</b> (Students are advised to have a back-up plan in case the first choice courses are not available)</p>

Insurance	<p><b>National Health Insurance</b> International students (D-2 visa holders) are automatically enrolled in the National Health Insurance at the time of Alien registration. * Certain nationals can be exempted from the Insurance and the student will need to apply for the exemption</p> <p><b>Private Insurance (International Student Insurance)</b> Students will be treated for minor illness such as cold, fever with a small fee when enrolled in the NHI. However students are asked to have a private insurance during their stay in case of unexpected accident(s).</p> <p>The private insurance must cover accident diseases and should be submitted before the visa documents are processed.</p>
Tuition	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Exchange student: Paid at home university and does not pay to Kookmin University</li> <li>2. Visiting student: Needs to pay the tuition at Kookmin University during their studies.</li> </ol>
Textbook and materials	<p>A textbook is normally KRW 30,000 ~ 50,000won and can be purchased at the book store on campus. (Student spend approx. KRW 100,000 ~ 200,000won/semester for textbooks) * Not all courses require a textbook * Used textbooks are not common in South Korea</p> <p>Students at School for Fine Arts, College of Design may need to pay for materials depending on their courses</p>
Housing (Dormitory)	<p>Students should pay for their housing directly. Especially if staying at an off-campus housing, all payment should be made to the landlord/residence.</p> <p>Dormitory fee will be waived for students coming from Universities with bilateral agreement.</p>
Foods	<p>Student cafeteria: Approx. KRW 3,000 ~ 5,000won per meal * There is no University-wide mealplan available.</p> <p>Restaurants near campus: Approx. KRW 6,000 ~ 9,000won per meal</p>
Other expenses	Students will be responsible for all additional costs needed for their studies in Korea

<p>General Campus Housing Information</p>	<p>At Kookmin University there are <b>on &amp; off-campus housing</b> managed by the university. While exchange/visiting students can apply for university managed housing, housing assignment is competitive and we cannot guarantee the placement.</p> <p>If private space is important, we advise students to consider staying at an off-campus location. Students may choose to stay at the <b>student residence</b> recommended by the International Affairs Division or find a place to stay on their own.</p>
<p>Type of On-Campus Accommodation</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. On Campus dormitory: 4 buildings are located on campus, all Quadruple rooms</li> <li>2. Jeongneung dormitory: 4 story building located 10 minutes on foot from the rear gate, all Quadruple room</li> <li>3. Gireum dormitory: 12 story building located in front of Gireum subway station exit #8, has limited number of Twin/Triple/Quadruple rooms</li> </ol> <p>* Only dormitory mentioned above houses study abroad students          * There is no common kitchen but refrigerator and microwave are available for residents (for instant cooking)</p>
<p>Student residence</p>	<p>Located near Hongdae-Ipgu station with private(single) rooms and a common kitchen. (Rent: approx. KRW 550,000 ~ 650,000/per month, deposit needed)</p>
<p>Private Accommodation</p>	<p>Must be arranged by the student. Recently students tend to use Airbnb or stay at a Goshiwon.</p> <p>* When finding a Private accommodation, students must check whether the location is eligible for Foreign resident registration</p>
