

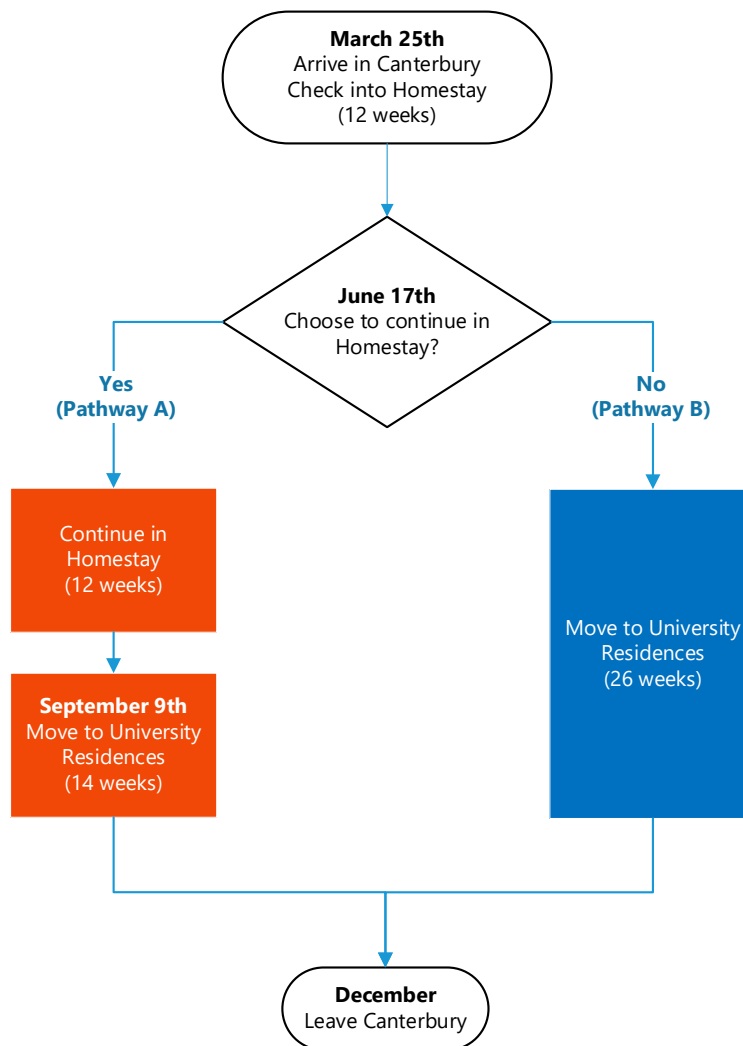

Accommodation Choices

The CCCU programme offers a mix of homestay and university apartments. University residences are usually also occupied by undergraduate students (aged 18 to 25) during term time (mid-September to mid-June)



Accommodation Information

The homestay properties are usually within 30 minutes' journey to campus (by foot or public transport). Your first 12 weeks of homestay will be provided on a half-board basis, after which you will be able to specify your own accommodation preferences subject to institutional availability.

University residences are self-catering and within 30 minutes' walk to campus (or a 10-minute bus journey). You will be provided with a single study bedroom with bedding, use of a shared kitchen, and have either shared or en-suite bathrooms (subject to availability). You also have access to payable washing machines. At busy times of the year, we may also refer you to another university accommodation provider.

We guarantee we will provide accommodation for the full length of your course, as long as you apply for accommodation online at least two months before arrival and abide by the licence conditions. www.canterbury.ac.uk/study-here/accommodation/short-courses.aspx We will do our best to help you get your preferred accommodation. However, we cannot guarantee your first choice of accommodation as it depends on availability.
