PROGRAM OF STUDY SELECTION AT UQAM

The choice of program of study must comply with the student exchange agreement established between UQAM and your home institution.

Please confirm with the exchange officer at your home university that the requested program of study is available.

COURSE SELECTION

All selected courses must be part of the **English program** or the **French program**.

- Students may take both English and French classes. A popular choice is four English classes and one French class per term.
- Information about courses in French and English as a second language can be found at: [langues.uqam.ca/programs/](https://langues.uqam.ca/programs/)
- The majority of courses offered at UQAM count for three credits. A three-credit course is equivalent to 45 hours of classes: three hours a week for 15 weeks.
- Each class involves approximately 45 hours of learning activities, including assessment, plus up to 3 hours of homework per week.
- The number of credits constituting a full-time, semester program at an undergraduate level is 12 to 15 credits (4 or 5 three-credit courses).
- You must register on a full-time basis and class attendance is mandatory.

APPLICATION FORM

After being selected (nomination by your home university), you must fill out the form to open your admission file for UQAM. Information about the MoveOn platform will then be sent to you by UQAM.

APPLICATION FILE

Your application file must be sent to UQAM via the MoveOn platform. You can create your MoveOn account after you receive instructions from the person in charge of international exchanges at UQAM. The following documents (in PDF format) will need to be submitted via the MoveOn platform.

- MoveOn application form
- Letter of Intent in English
- One reference letter in English from a professor from the home university
- Up-to-date official university transcript
- Complete list of courses in which you are currently enrolled
- Proof of language skills (see ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY EXAMS)
- Photocopy of family registry showing the full names of your parents (戸籍謄本)

You must provide the original document, as well as an official translation.

All documents submitted must be translated into French or English. No file sent by email or regular mail will be accepted.

Program Entry Level in French

Candidates must achieve a minimum placement of intermediate level B1 (as determined by the French placement test at UQAM)

Please note that it is the responsibility of partner institutions to specify any additional language requirements.



The Registrar’s Office of UQAM will send you the official decision (acceptance or refusal) by email. This email will include an access link to the UQAM student portal:

- between **May 15th** and **July 1st** if your file arrives at UQAM by the April 1st deadline
- between **November 1st** and **December 15th**: if your file arrives at UQAM by the September 15th deadline

COURSE REGISTRATION



A few weeks after receiving your official admission letter, you will receive your PIN by email. The PIN [NIP in French] is your access code for the UQAM student portal for classes you are eligible to take.



You must take either the English Placement Test (45\$) or the French Placement Test (45\$) or both, depending on your program of study. This will determine the level of your English or French classes.

If you are a student studying English, and you wish to add a beginner French class to your exchange program, the French placement test is not required.



After receiving your test results, you will meet with the Program Director who will advise you of the classes you can choose from.



After this meeting, you will be able to register for classes.

- If you wish to register in French as a second language classes, you will take a French Placement Test (\$45 CAD).
- If you are a beginner, you will be asked to attend a brief interview to determine which French class you can register for.
- **It is strongly encouraged to take the placement test online before arriving, but there is an additional 20\$ fee to take the online version of the test.** We will provide instructions regarding the placement test in a welcome letter.



IMMIGRATION

Two-semester exchange or fee-paying program

Since this is a study program lasting more than six months (two semesters), you must obtain a Certificate of Acceptance from Quebec (CAQ) and a study permit. We recommend that you begin your immigration process as soon as you receive the admission letter from UQAM, as the process can a few months.

Single-semester exchange or fee-paying program

If you participate in a full-time exchange or fee-paying program for a single semester, you do not require a CAQ or a study permit for that period. You must ensure that you have an eTA or a valid temporary resident visa; see the Government of Canada website on immigration.



Note: You will need to provide your biometrics as part of your application for a study permit. This could result in additional delays.



PREPARING FOR YOUR STAY

Before your arrival at UQAM, the Japanese Student Coordinator will contact you with important information such as what to bring, housing options, classes, and more.

MANDATORY INSURANCE

As a foreign student, you automatically subscribe to the UQAM health and hospitalization insurance. The subscription fees for this plan are approximately \$350 CAD per term. No other medical insurance will be recognized by UQAM.



TRANSCRIPTS OF GRADES

A transcript of your grades will be sent to your personal email address by the Registrar’s Office approximately eight weeks after the end of the semester.



HOUSING

There are three housing options organized by the Japanese Student Coordinator :

- UQAM residence hall (approx. \$500-600 CAD/month plus housing insurance approx. \$35-\$45 CAD/month),
- Homestay (approx. \$1300 CAD/month including meals),
- Apartment share (approx. \$600-800 CAD/month).
